ANNOUNCEMENT BY COMMITTEE ON RULES REGARDING AMENDMENT PROCESS FOR H.R. 1215, PROTECTING ACCESS TO CARE ACT OF 2017, AND H.R. 1304, SELF-INSURANCE PROTECTION ACT
