OF SILENCE MOMENT FOR THE VICTIMS OF THREE GUN VIO-LENCE AT THE VETERANS HOME OF CALIFORNIA-YOUNTVILLE

Mr. THOMPSON of California. Mr. Speaker, I rise today with a very sad and heavy heart to ask that we stand for a moment of silence for three of my constituents who were murdered in another senseless act of gun violence, three women at the California Veterans Home in Napa Valley, California,
