FORMERLY INCARCERATED REEN-TER SOCIETY TRANSFORMED SAFELY TRANSITIONING EVERY PERSON ACT

TITLE I—RECIDIVISM REDUCTION

SEC. 101. RISK AND NEEDS ASSESSMENT SYSTEM.

(a) IN GENERAL.—Chapter 229 of title 18, United States Code, is amended by inserting after subchapter C the following:

"SUBCHAPTER D-RISK AND NEEDS ASSESSMENT SYSTEM

"3631. Duties of the Attorney General.

"3632. Development of risk and needs assessment system.

"3633. Evidence-based recidivism reduction program and recommendations. "3634, Report

"3635. Definitions.

"§ 3631. Duties of the Attorney General

"(a) IN GENERAL.—The Attorney General shall carry out this subchapter in consultation with-

"(1) the Director of the Bureau of Prisons; "(2) the Director of the Administrative Office of the United States Courts;

"(3) the Director of the Office of Probation

and Pretrial Services; "(4) the Director of the National Institute

of Justice; and "(5) the Director of the National Institute

of Corrections.

"(b) DUTIES.—The Attorney General shall— "(1) conduct a review of the existing prisoner risk and needs assessment systems in operation on the date of the enactment of the FIRST STEP Act;

"(2) develop recommendations regarding evidence-based recidivism reduction programs and productive activities in accordance with section 3633;
