### WE MUST REOPEN THE GOVERNMENT

(Mr. THOMPSON of Pennsylvania asked and was given permission to address the House for 1 minute and to revise and extend his remarks.)

Mr. THOMPSON of Pennsylvania. Mr. Speaker, we must reopen the government.

I find it troubling that a majority of the Senate Democrats have chosen to severely jeopardize our military readiness, shut down central government operations, and eliminate healthcare coverage for low-income children, all while setting an arbitrary deadline to address the DACA issue.

Mr. Speaker, I know that we must achieve comprehensive immigration reform, which includes providing certainty on the status of those brought here as children, but a government shutdown is not the way to achieve that public policy.

We must continue to work towards a bipartisan agreement to protect the fate of the DREAMers and to ensure our borders are secure for the safety of all Americans.

In accordance with the law, my Bellefonte and Titusville district offices will be closed, and many of my staff members are furloughed for the duration of any budget impasse. I will remain here in Washington working to get this impasse resolved.

It is my hope that cooler heads will prevail and we can quickly find a resolution to reopen the Federal Government.

### REPUBLICANS WILL NOT TAKE YES FOR AN ANSWER

Mr. HOYER. Mr. Speaker, we are in the second day of this Trump shutdown because Republicans won't take yes for an answer.

Senator SCHUMER went to the White House and had a deal with President Trump until the Freedom Caucus vetoed it and forced the President to go back on his word again.

Senator SCHUMER offered President Trump his border wall. Republicans said no.

Senate Democrats offered short-term continuing resolutions to keep the government open. Republicans said no.

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THE SCHUMER SHUTDOWN  
CONTINUES

(Mr. WILSON of South Carolina asked and was given permission to address the House for 1 minute and to revise and extend his remarks.)

Mr. WILSON of South Carolina. Mr. Speaker, yesterday the editors of the National Review explained the Schumer shutdown clearly in their editorial, "Hang Tough, Republicans."

In no uncertain terms, Senate Democrats have blocked a bill to keep the Federal Government running and fund the Children's Health Insurance Program for the next 6 years. Senate Democrats have made a choice not to keep the government open.

A government shutdown does not benefit anyone. It causes irreparable harm to our military. Over 100,000 National Guard members will be sent home from weekend training, and over 2 million servicemembers will have their pay disrupted by the Senate Democrats' partisan politics.

REPUBLICANS' CYNICAL EFFORTS

Mr. PALLONE. Mr. Speaker, I just want to address the cynical effort by the Republicans to link the Trump shutdown to Children's Health Insurance Program, or CHIP.

The fact of the matter is, if the Republicans cared about children's health insurance or anybody's health insurance:

They wouldn't have tried repeatedly to repeal the Affordable Care Act.

They wouldn't have put the provision in their tax scam that says that people don't have to buy insurance, which we estimate will result in about 13 million Americans losing their health insurance.

They wouldn't have put a CHIP bill on the floor earlier this month, or earlier this year, that basically eliminated or cut back on the prevention fund and, at the same time, said, if you didn't pay your health insurance within the first 30 days, you would lose it,

which the CBO says would cause another half a million people to lose their health insurance.

The only reason why you linked the CHIP bill to the CR this week is because you don't have to pay the subsidies for people's health insurance because they are going to lose it.
