## H. RES. 1046

Whereas the 19th Amendment extended the franchise to women across the United States; Whereas August 18, 2020, marks the centennial of the ratification of the 19th Amendment by three-fourths of the States;

Whereas August 26, 2020, marks the centennial of the 19th Amendment becoming part of the Constitution of the United States;

Whereas the centennial of the ratification of the 19th Amendment is a pivotal chapter in the history of American democracy;

Whereas the ratification of the Amendment marks the single largest expansion of voting rights in United States history;

the ratification of the Amendment did not, in practice, guarantee voting rights to all American women, as African-American women, Native American
