On Saturday, December 10, 2022, the Phoebus Phantoms won the Class 3 State Championship Game against the Heritage High School Pioneers with a score of 48-7. This is the second year in a row Phoebus High School has claimed the title. Led by Coach Jeremy Blunt, the Phantoms won this title on the tail end of an equally astounding season. HALT ALL LETHAL TRAFFICKING OF FENTANYL ACT

Mr. FITZGERALD. Mr. Chair, I rise in strong support of H.R. 467, the HALT Fentanyl Act.

This critical legislation accomplishes a top legislative priority I have been advocating since coming to Congress, which would permanently classify fentanyl-related substances as Schedule I drugs.

I'd like to share two moving stories of constituents from my district taken from their families too soon. Archie Badura, of Oconomowoc, tragically passed away at the age of 19, due to an accidental overdose in 2014. Since then, his mother, Lauri Badura has dedicated herself to advocate on behalf of those struggling with mental health and substance abuse and started a grassroots organization called, "Saving Others For Archie" to help fight the opioid epidemic. Logan Rachwal (Rockwall), of Pewaukee, who was also 19 and a freshman at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, passed away in 2021 from an overdose of three different forms of fentanyl, His parents, Erin and Rick Rachwal, also started an organization, the Love, Logan Foundation, to work to end the stigma surrounding mental health and substance abuse disorder and raise awareness of the dangers of fentanyl and other illicit substances.

As a father and grandfather, this issue hits close to home. No parent should have to experience the pain the Badura and Rachwal families have had to endure. We need strong congressional action on fentanyl, and we need the permanent designation of fentanyl-related substances to Schedule I. I want to thank Congressman GRIFFITH for leading this effort alongside Congressman LATTA.

I strongly urge my colleagues to support this legislation.

Mrs. DINGELL. Mr. Speaker, I rise today to celebrate Virginia Basler, a resident of Ypsi-

lanti, Michigan on the occasion of her 100th birthday. Her dedication to her country and local community is worthy of commendation.

Virginia was born in Alpena, Michigan on a family farm as the middle of three children. During WWII, while her older brother enlisted in the Air Force, Virginia and a friend moved down to Ypsilanti to work at the Willow Run Bomber Plant. For almost two years, she worked on the production line, drilling rivet holes for B-24 Liberator bombers.

As soon as she met the age requirement, Virginia enlisted in the Coast Guard Women's Reserves (SPARS) in order to serve her country in another way. She attended Boot Camp at Sheepshead Bay, New York where she was trained as a baker, and she was assigned to the Coast Guard Station in Washington, D.C. where she would remain for the duration of the war. After her service was finished, Virginia came back to Ypsilanti where she again worked at the Willow Run Plant, now a Kaiser-Frazer car factory.

In the decades since, Virginia has lived a full life. She married Leonard, a WWII veteran himself, and raised a family of three children. She continued her life of service, cooking for Ypsilanti Public Schools and Eastern Michigan University. Since her retirement in 1990, Virginia has been active in the community, volunteering for Meals on Wheels and the local charity Thrift Shop. She has been very active with the American Rosie the Riveter Association, attending events with other Rosies and WWII vets. We were overjoyed to host Virginia and other Rosies in the Capitol during the Honor Flight event last month.

Mr. Speaker, I ask my colleagues to join me today in celebrating Virginia Basler's tremendous life of service to her community and her nation. No request for help has ever been too big or too small for her to consider. We thank her for her service and wish her the happiest of birthdays.
