RECOGNIZING THE HISTORY OF THE JEFFERSON HIGHWAY

Mr. FALLON. Mr. Speaker, I rise today to commemorate the remarkable history of the Jefferson Highway that runs through Bonham, Texas. This route was America's first north-south intercontinental roadway and was inspired by the east-west Lincoln Highway that connected Times Square in New York City, New York, to Lincoln Park in San Francisco, California.

The Jefferson Highway was first laid in the 1910s as part of the National Auto Trail system and was named for President Thomas Jefferson. Its southern terminus was in New Orleans, Louisiana, and ran through several North Texas cities, including Bonham, before finally coming to a stop in Winnipeg, Canada. It was aptly known as the "Pine to Palm Highway" for the types of trees that drivers could find at either end of the route.

In its early years, Bonham residents were fierce advocates for the Jefferson Highway to run through their town to improve automobile access across state lines. In fact, in the Jefferson Highway Declaration in January of 1918, the citizens of Bonham famously declared: "May Bonham live a thousand years less a day, for Bonham would not care to be on the map should the Jefferson Highway go some other way."

Over a hundred years ago, millions of Americans took the same highway, drove on the same roads, and pushed the boundaries of innovation to lay the foundations of the civilization that we know today.

I have requested the United States flag to be flown over our Nation's Capital to recognize the importance of the Jefferson Highway

Jack was born in Lowell in 1944. After graduating from Keith Academy in 1963, Jack would go on to study business at Boston College. He then attended Officer Candidate School in Newport, Rhode Island where he would later graduate and proudly serve his country as a Lieutenant in the United States Navy from 1967 to 1970.

After the Navy, Jack returned to his hometown of Lowell where he embarked on a 3 decades-long professional career at his cherished family-founded local paper, The Lowell Sun. Jack got his start as a sports writer before quickly moving up through the ranks to sports editor, to editor, and ultimately taking his destined position as the Sun's publisher. He was known for his integrity, persistence, decisiveness, and ability to extract the best out of his employees and those around him. The Sun thrived under Jack's leadership due to his mission of keeping the paper hyperlocal,

so residents were always informed of what was happening in their community. Over the span of his career, Jack carefully curated a local paper that was dedicated to delivering accurate and relevant news to the Greater Lowell area.

When he wasn't working tirelessly to ensure the Sun ran smoothly, Jack was involved in the revitalization of his hometown. His expertise and vision for the future of the City made him a trusted confidant to many business and political leaders over the years. He served as Chairman of the Lowell Memorial Auditorium, which welcomed many talented artists to perform at the venue under his stewardship. Jack also served as Chairman of the Tsongas Arena Commission and was instrumental in the arena's creation. In addition to these accomplishments, he is also responsible for helping to bring professional hockey and baseball teams to Lowell for the community to enjoy. Jack's contributions to Lowell have made a lasting impact on the city and will continue to be felt for generations to come.

Mr. BEAN of Florida. Mr. Speaker, did you know that September is national Brain Aneurysm Awareness month?

The Trinity Love Hoblit Foundation certainly does. The Foundation is a nonprofit, headquartered in Florida and named after Trinity, who at age 9 was diagnosed with multiple brain aneurysms. In 2015, Trinity was scheduled for open brain surgery but passed away 2 days prior because her aneurysm ruptured.

About 1 in 50 Americans have an unruptured brain aneurysm. Brain aneurysms are more common and harmful than people know.

Mr. Speaker, while her passing was a tragic loss for our community, The Trinity Love Hoblit Foundation honors her legacy through raising awareness, supporting research, and identifying training for brain aneurysms at Wolfson's Children's Hospital and Baptist Neurological Institute in Jacksonville, Florida.
