Mr. Cannady worked 27 years at WTOC, providing fair and accurate coverage as WTOC's bureau chief. During his time at WTOC, he covered very important stories, such as Fort Stewart/Hinesville helping fight the war on terror, the tomato patch murder in Long County, the Santa Claus mini-mart murder in Toombs County, and many other stories.

His work at WTOC was defined by compassion, intelligence, and kindness.

WTOC labeled him as the person who knew things before everyone else, the person who knows who to call, and the person who knew how to ask tough questions respectfully.

I know WTOC and their viewers will miss Dal's expertise, but we are thrilled to see him move on to a new role in the Bulloch community.

IMPENDING GOVERNMENT SHUTDOWN

(Mr. PAYNE asked and was given permission to address the House for 1 minute and to revise and extend his remarks.)

Mr. PAYNE. Mr. Speaker, I rise today to discuss the impending government shutdown.

Since 1980, there have been at least 14 times when the government was shut down. All of them were initiated by the Republicans. The last major one in 2018 cost our country \$3 billion in lost economic activity.

Now, Speaker MCCARTHY has the country on a collision course with another one. Even the Senate Republicans have a bipartisan bill to help prevent a shutdown, but Speaker MCCARTHY will not even consider it.
