Res. 3, providing for congressional disapproval under chapter 8 of title 5, United States Code, of the rule submitted by the Internal Revenue Service relating to "Gross Proceeds Reporting by Brokers That Regularly Provide Services Effectuating Digital Asset Sales". If the motion is agreed to on the motion to proceed to consideration of S.J. Res. 3, all time during recess will count equally between the proponents and opponents.
