Program for Tuesday: After the transaction of any morning business (not to extend beyond 11 a.m.), Senate is expected to vote on the motion to proceed to consideration of S.J. Res. 3, providing for congressional disapproval under chapter 8 of title 5, United States Code, of the rule submitted by the Internal Revenue Service relating to “Gross Proceeds Reporting by Brokers That Regularly Provide Services Effectuating Digital Asset Sales”. If the motion is agreed to on the motion to proceed to consideration of S.J. Res. 3, all time during recess will count equally between the proponents and opponents.

(Senate will recess from 12:30 p.m. until 2:15 p.m. for their respective party conferences.)

(At 9 p.m., the President of the United States will address a Joint Session of Congress. Senators will assemble in the Senate Chamber at 8:20 p.m. and proceed as a body to the House Chamber at 8:25 p.m.)
