PROTECTING OUR NATION'S CAPITAL EMERGENCY ACT

Mr. COMER. H.R. 2096

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled.

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

This Act may be cited as the "Protecting Our Nation's Capital Emergency Act".
