A bill to authorize appropriations for fiscal year 2026 for intelligence and intelligence-related activities of the United States Government, the Community Management Account, and the Central Intelligence Agency Retirement and Disability System, and for other purposes; with an amendment (Rept. 119-389). Referred to the Committee of the Whole House on the state of the Union.

Mr. HILL of Arkansas: Committee on Financial Services. H.R. 1013. A bill to amend the Federal securities laws to enhance 403(b) plans, and for other purposes; with an amendment (Rept. 119-390). Referred to the Committee of the Whole House on the state of the Union.
