S. 1353. A bill to extend the authority for modifications to the Second Division Memorial in the District of Columbia; to the Committee on Energy and Natural Resources.

At the request of Mr. TUBERVILLE, the name of the Senator from Utah (Mr. CURTIS) was added as a cosponsor of S. 100, a bill to repeal the Corporate Transparency Act.

S. 292

At the request of Mr. CASSIDY, the name of the Senator from Florida (Mrs. MOODY) was added as a cosponsor of S. 292, a bill to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to allow a credit against tax for charitable donations to nonprofit organizations providing education scholarships to qualified elementary and secondary students.

S. 694

At the request of Mr. TILLIS, the names of the Senator from North Carolina (Mr. BUDD) and the Senator from California (Mr. PADILLA) were added as cosponsors of S. 694, a bill to amend title XVIII of the Social Security Act to provide a phase-in for plasma-derived products under the manufacturer discount program.

S. 701

Veterans Affairs to establish the Veteran Family Resource Program, and for other purposes.

S. 728

S. 847

At the request of Mrs. BRITT, the names of the Senator from North Carolina (Mr. TILLIS) and the Senator from New Hampshire (Ms. HASSAN) were added as cosponsors of S. 847, a bill to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to expand the employer-provided child care credit and the dependent care assistance exclusion.

S. 877

At the request of Mr. SCHUMER, the names of the Senator from Hawaii (Mr. SCHATZ) and the Senator from Texas (Mr. CRUZ) were added as cosponsors of S. 877, a bill to require the Secretary of the Treasury to mint commemorative coins in recognition of the life and legacy of Roberto Clemente.

S. 921

At the request of Mr. BANKS, the name of the Senator from Florida (Mr. SCOTT) was added as a cosponsor of S. 921, a bill to direct the Secretary of Health and Human Services to issue guidance on whether hospital emergency departments should implement fentanyl testing as a routine procedure for patients experiencing an overdose, and for other purposes.

S. 932

At the request of Mr. MULLIN, the names of the Senator from Florida (Mr. SCOTT) and the Senator from Maine (Ms. COLLINS) were added as cosponsors of S. 932, a bill to amend the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act with respect to molecularly targeted pediatric cancer investigations, and for other purposes.

S. 1032

S. 1172
