### MEASURES PLACED ON THE CALENDAR

The following bills were read the second time, and placed on the calendar:

S. 3030. A bill making continuing appropriations for military pay in the event of a Government shutdown, and for other purposes.

S. 3031. A bill making continuing appropriations for essential Federal Aviation Administration and Transportation Security Administration pay and operations in the event of a Federal Government shutdown, and for other purposes.

S. 3032. A bill to extend the authority for the protections of certain facilities and assets from unmanned aircraft.

### MEASURES PLACED ON THE CALENDAR—S. 3030, S. 3031, S. 3032

A bill (S. 3032) to extend the authority for the protections of certain facilities and assets from unmanned aircraft.

Mr. THUNE. Mr. President, in order to place the bills on the calendar under the provisions of rule XIV, I would object to further proceedings, en bloc.
