Whereas, WBBM has been featured in Ebony Magazine, Inside Gospel Today, Gospel USA, Saved Magazine and numerous others;

Whereas, WBBM received the highest honor in the gospel industry as the prestigious 2007 Stellar Award Radio Station of the Year in a large market;

Whereas, WBBM reaches over 1,500,000 homes and business, was one of the first radio stations to stream its broadcast live via the Internet, and has FACEBOOK reach of 2.081 million;
