Mr. CARTER of Texas. Mr. Speaker, I rise today to honor the life and service of Specialist Fourth Class Albert Fountain King, Jr., a United States Army veteran who served his Nation with honor and who was laid to rest on July 1, 2026, at Central Texas State Veterans Cemetery in Killeen, Texas. He will be buried with full military honors, as every veteran deserves.

Albert Fountain King, Jr. answered the call to serve, enlisting in the United States Army on May 12, 1961. He served as a Field Communication Crewman, a role essential to the coordination and command that holds our military together. He was awarded the Good Conduct Medal and qualified as a Marksman with the M-14 rifle. He was honorably discharged on April 27, 1964, having faithfully fulfilled his commitment to this Nation.

We do not know all the chapters of Albert's life. But we know the most important one: when his country called, he served. He wore the uniform, he earned his discharge honorably, and he deserves to be remembered.

Today, his name stands as testimony that Albert Fountain King, Jr., was not forgotten. No veteran should ever be. On behalf of the people of Texas's 31st Congressional District, I extend my deepest gratitude and respect to a soldier who gave his service to this country.

May he rest in peace, and may he finally receive the honors he has long been owed.

Ms. WILSON of Florida. Mr. Speaker, from the 24th District of the great state of Florida, I rise today to recognize and honor Reverend Wilner Maxy, a well-respected religious leader, and dedicated community and international activist.

Reverend Maxy is one of the founding members of Emmanuel Haitian Baptist Church, in Miami, in 1973, and has been the pastor of the church since 1983. In that time, he has served as a dedicated liaison between Miami-Dade County's Haitian and Baptist communities and the local and statewide government officials. His selfless service as chairman of the Haitian Pastors Association, a member of the Board of Trustees for Baptist Health Systems, and other boards in the community show his passion for both his religion and his community.

In his 30 years of passionate leadership, Reverend Maxy has helped the Emmanuel Haitian Baptist Church grow from 200 members to over 1,300, created a scholarship for young men and women who wish to go to seminary and enter the ministry, expanded the church's outreach program to include eight churches and three schools in Haiti, as well as

planned to broaden the ministry to Orlando, Pompano Beach, and South Miami.

Because of his efforts to keep crime and drugs from ruining the lives of those in his community, he has been awarded the key to the city of Miami by Mayor Manny Diaz and County Mayor Alex Alvarez. He was also given the honor of having April 1st designated as Wilner Maxy Day in the City of North Miami by Mayor Andre Pierre.
