Environmental Protection Agency* that requires an indistinguishable surface connection to exist for waters adjacent to "waters of the United States", which are relatively permanent, standing, or continuously flowing bodies of water, to be subject to the Clean Water Act and federal regulation and jurisdiction, and the Legislature opposes any federal assertion of jurisdiction inconsistent with that standard; jointly to the Committees on Energy and Commerce and Transportation and Infrastructure.
