S. 2357. A bill to reauthorize the Young Fishermen's Development Act, and for other purposes (Rept. No. 119-115).

S. 1552. A bill to promote and protect from discrimination living organ donors.

S. 4047. A bill to establish an alternative use of certain Federal education funds when in-person instruction is not available; to the Committee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions.

S. 4048. A bill to amend the Public Health Service to require the Secretary to award grants, contracts, or cooperative agreements to eligible entities to establish, maintain, or improve activities related to the detection and monitoring of infectious diseases through wastewater for public health emergency preparedness and response purposes, and for other purposes; to the Committee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions.

By Mr. KAINE (for himself, Mr. WARNOCK, Mr. WYDEN, Mr. KING, Mr.

S. 4049. A bill to repeal section 122 of the Trade Act of 1974 relating to balance-of-payments authority; to the Committee on Finance.

By Ms. WARREN (for herself, Mr. HAWLEY, Ms. CORTEZ MASTO, Mrs. BRITT, Mr. GALLEGGO, Mr. CRAMER, Mr. WARNER, Mr. VAN HOLLEN, Ms. SMITH, Mr. WARNOCK, Mr. FETTERMAN, Mr. KIM, Ms. BLUNT ROCHESTER, and Ms. ALSOBROOKS):

S. 4050. A bill to amend the Federal Deposit Insurance Act to clarify that the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation and appropriate Federal regulators have the authority to claw back certain compensation paid to executives, and for other purposes; to the Committee on Banking, Housing, and Urban Affairs.

By Ms. COLLINS (for herself, Ms. KLOBUCHAR, Ms. MURKOWSKI, Mr. PETERS, and Ms. LUMMIS):

S. 4051. A bill to require the Secretary of the Treasury to mint and issue coins that are emblematic of the National Fallen Firefighters Memorial and the service and sacrifice of firefighters throughout the history of the United States; to the Committee on Banking, Housing, and Urban Affairs.

By Mr. SCHMITT (for himself and Mr. HAWLEY):

S. 4052. A bill to designate the facility of the United States Postal Service located at 203 North Clay Street in Marshfield, Missouri, shall be known and designated as the "Edwin P. Hubble Post Office"; to the Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs.

S. 4058. A bill to authorize the National Foundation for the Arts and the National Foundation for the Humanities to support activities for the purpose of broadening public understanding of civics and the United States Constitution; to the Committee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions.

S. 4059. A bill to provide requirements for Executive agency spending at the end of a fiscal year, and for other purposes; to the Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs.

By Mr. BLUMENTHAL (for himself and Mr. KIM):

S. 4060. A bill to provide national safeguards to prevent abuse and fraud in online prediction markets, prevent underage use of online prediction markets, protect consumers, and return regulatory authorities and oversight of online prediction markets to States; to the Committee on the Judiciary.

S. 4063. A bill to impose sanctions on the Polisario Front if it cooperates with an Iranian-affiliated terrorist organization; to the Committee on Foreign Relations.

S. 4064. A bill to provide for a system of regulation of the offer and sale of digital commodities by the Commodity Futures Trading Commission, and for other purposes; read the first time.

S. 4065. A bill to require the imposition of sanctions with respect to the People's Republic of China if the People's Republic of China threatens the security of Taiwan, and for other purposes; to the Committee on Banking, Housing, and Urban Affairs.

S. 4066. A bill to provide that the approved application under the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act for the drug mifepristone for the purpose of the termination of intrauterine pregnancy is deemed to have been withdrawn, to establish a Federal tort for harm to women caused by chemical abortion drugs, and for other purposes; to the Committee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions.

SUBMISSION OF CONCURRENT AND SENATE RESOLUTIONS

The following concurrent resolutions and Senate resolutions were read, and referred (or acted upon), as indicated:

By Mr. GALLEGGO:

S. Res. 638. A resolution expressing the sense of the Senate that the law enforcement

agents and other personnel of the Department of Justice and the Department of Homeland Security, who have been temporarily engaging in civil immigration enforcement operations, should be returned to their primary missions during periods of active hostility with Iran; to the Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs.

By Mr. KIM:

S. Res. 639. A resolution establishing an annual Senate academic civics competition for secondary school students; to the Committee on Rules and Administration.

ADDITIONAL COSPONSORS

S. 567

At the request of Mr. WHITEHOUSE, the name of the Senator from South Dakota (Mr. ROUNDS) was added as a cosponsor of S. 567, a bill to award a Congressional Gold Medal, collectively, to the First Rhode Island Regiment, in recognition of their dedicated service during the Revolutionary War.

S. 754

At the request of Mr. COTTON, the name of the Senator from Wyoming (Mr. BARRASSO) was added as a cosponsor of S. 754, a bill to direct the Secretary of Agriculture to periodically assess cybersecurity threats to, and vulnerabilities in, the agriculture and food critical infrastructure sector and to provide recommendations to enhance their security and resilience, to require the Secretary of Agriculture to conduct an annual cross-sector simulation exercise relating to a food-related emergency or disruption, and for other purposes.

S. 1227

At the request of Mr. MARKEY, the name of the Senator from Nebraska (Mr. RICKETTS) was added as a cosponsor of S. 1227, a bill to require the Administrator of the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services and the Commissioner of Social Security to review and simplify the processes, procedures, forms, and communications for family caregivers to assist individuals in establishing eligibility for, enrolling in, and maintaining and utilizing coverage and benefits under the Medicare, Medicaid, CHIP, and Social Security programs respectively, and for other purposes.

S. 1296

At the request of Mr. TILLIS, the name of the Senator from Louisiana (Mr. KENNEDY) was added as a cosponsor of S. 1296, a bill to amend the Higher Education Act of 1965 to strengthen disclosure requirements relating to foreign gifts and contracts, to prohibit contracts between institutions of higher education and certain foreign entities and countries of concern, and for other purposes.

S. 1470

At the request of Mr. LUJÁN, his name and the name of the Senator from Montana (Mr. SHEEHY) were added as cosponsors of S. 1470, a bill to require the Secretary of Agriculture and the Secretary of the Interior to

prioritize the completion of the Continental Divide National Scenic Trail, and for other purposes.

S. 1552

At the request of Mr. COTTON, the names of the Senator from Indiana (Mr. BANKS) and the Senator from California (Mr. PADILLA) were added as cosponsors of S. 1552, a bill to promote and protect from discrimination living organ donors.

S. 1677

At the request of Ms. BALDWIN, the name of the Senator from Hawaii (Ms. HIRONO) was added as a cosponsor of S. 1677, a bill to provide health insurance benefits for outpatient and inpatient items and services related to the diagnosis and treatment of a congenital anomaly or birth defect.

S. 2022

At the request of Ms. CORTEZ MASTO, the name of the Senator from Wisconsin (Ms. BALDWIN) was added as a cosponsor of S. 2022, a bill to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to treat Indian Tribal Governments in the same manner as State governments for certain Federal tax purposes, and for other purposes.

S. 2518

At the request of Mr. BENNET, the names of the Senator from New Mexico (Mr. LUJÁN) and the Senator from West Virginia (Mrs. CAPITO) were added as cosponsors of S. 2518, a bill to amend title XVIII of the Social Security Act to revise payment for air ambulance services under the Medicare program.

S. 3062

At the request of Mr. HAWLEY, the name of the Senator from Tennessee (Mrs. BLACKBURN) was added as a cosponsor of S. 3062, a bill to require artificial intelligence chatbots to implement age verification measures and make certain disclosures, and for other purposes.

S. 3169

At the request of Mr. KIM, the name of the Senator from California (Mr. PADILLA) was added as a cosponsor of S. 3169, a bill to amend the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 to expand new home construction, and for other purposes.

S. 3188

At the request of Mr. COONS, the names of the Senator from California (Mr. PADILLA) and the Senator from Indiana (Mr. YOUNG) were added as cosponsors of S. 3188, a bill to establish a Biopharmaceutical Center of Excellence, and for other purposes.

S. 3287

At the request of Mr. CRAMER, the name of the Senator from Arkansas (Mr. COTTON) was added as a cosponsor of S. 3287, a bill to prohibit the allocation of costs for certain electric transmission facilities to consumers in a State the public officials of which did not expressly consent to the transmission facility, and for other purposes.

S. 3341

At the request of Mr. HICKENLOOPER, the name of the Senator from North

Carolina (Mr. BUDD) was added as a cosponsor of S. 3341, a bill to amend the Small Business Investment Act of 1958 to exclude from the limit on leverage certain amounts invested in smaller enterprises located in rural or low-income areas and small businesses in critical technology areas, and for other purposes.

S. 3528

At the request of Mr. SCHIFF, the name of the Senator from Connecticut (Mr. BLUMENTHAL) was added as a cosponsor of S. 3528, a bill to amend the Food, Agriculture, Conservation, and Trade Act of 1990 to direct the Secretary of Agriculture to establish research centers of excellence for alternative protein innovation, and for other purposes.

S. 3775

At the request of Mrs. GILLIBRAND, the name of the Senator from New Mexico (Mr. HEINRICH) was added as a cosponsor of S. 3775, a bill to reduce the incidence of death by underride by enhancing underride protection on trailers, semitrailers, and single unit trucks, which will result in more survivable truck crashes, to improve motor carrier, passenger motor vehicle, and Vulnerable Road User safety, and for other purposes.

S. 3788

At the request of Mr. SCOTT of Florida, the name of the Senator from North Dakota (Mr. CRAMER) was added as a cosponsor of S. 3788, a bill to amend the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act to require drug labeling to include original manufacturer and supply chain information.

S. 3843

At the request of Mrs. MOODY, the name of the Senator from Georgia (Mr. OSSOFF) was added as a cosponsor of S. 3843, a bill to amend the Federal Crop Insurance Act to direct the Federal Crop Insurance Corporation to conduct research and development on frost or cold weather insurance, and for other purposes.

S. 3865

At the request of Mrs. MURRAY, the name of the Senator from California (Mr. SCHIFF) was added as a cosponsor of S. 3865, a bill to prevent discrimination, including harassment, in employment.

S. 3893

At the request of Mr. LEE, the names of the Senator from Wyoming (Ms. LUMMIS) and the Senator from Wisconsin (Ms. BALDWIN) were added as cosponsors of S. 3893, a bill to amend the Foreign Intelligence Surveillance Act of 1978 to reauthorize and reform certain authorities and to provide greater transparency and oversight.

S. 3900

At the request of Mr. MCCORMICK, the names of the Senator from Alaska (Mr. SULLIVAN) and the Senator from Pennsylvania (Mr. FETTERMAN) were added as cosponsors of S. 3900, a bill to promote human rights, internet freedom
