INTRODUCTION OF BILLS AND JOINT RESOLUTIONS

The following bills and joint resolutions were introduced, read the first and second times by unanimous consent, and referred as indicated:

By Mr. COTTON:

S. 4105. A bill to include any felony conviction as a ground for revocation of naturalization, to strike the 5-year limitation on the revocation of naturalization for membership in certain totalitarian or treasonous organizations, and to eliminate the 10-year statute of limitation for certain criminal penalties that would disqualify a person from naturalization; to the Committee on the Judiciary.

S. 4106. A bill to amend title 10, United States Code, to improve access to certain medications under the TRICARE program, and for other purposes; to the Committee on the Judiciary.

S. 4112. A bill to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to extend the credit period for the production of refined coal, and for other purposes; to the Committee on Finance.

S. 4113. A bill to provide for limitations on the use of artificial intelligence by Depart-

ment of Defense; to the Committee on Armed Services.

S. 4125. A bill to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to impose a tax on damages received by certain officers of the United

S. 4126. A bill to address the ineligibility of Ashli Babbitt for military funeral honors; read the first time.

S. 478
