ADDITIONAL COSPONSORS

S. 275

At the request of Mr. MORAN, the name of the Senator from Ohio (Mr. HUSTED) was added as a cosponsor of S. 275, a bill to improve the provision of care and services under the Veterans Community Care Program of the Department of Veterans Affairs, and for other purposes.

S. 567
