At the request of Mr. BARRASSO, the name of the Senator from Pennsylvania (Mr. MCCORMICK) was added as a

cosponsor of S. 680, a bill to prohibit funding for the Montreal Protocol on Substances that Deplete the Ozone Layer and the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change until China is no longer defined as a developing country.

At the request of Mr. GRASSLEY, the names of the Senator from Minnesota (Ms. KLOBUCHAR), the Senator from North Carolina (Mr. TILLIS), the Senator from Hawaii (Ms. HIRONO), the Senator from Connecticut (Mr. BLUMENTHAL), the Senator from California (Mr. PADILLA), the Senator from Vermont (Mr. WELCH) and the Senator from Illinois (Mr. DURBIN) were added as cosponsors of S. 736, a bill to increase the penalty for prohibited provision of a phone in a correctional facility, and for other purposes.

S. 825

At the request of Mr. GRASSLEY, the names of the Senator from Minnesota (Ms. KLOBUCHAR), the Senator from North Carolina (Mr. TILLIS), the Senator from Hawaii (Ms. HIRONO), the Senator from California (Mr. PADILLA), the Senator from Vermont (Mr. WELCH) and the Senator from Texas (Mr. CRUZ) were added as cosponsors of S. 825, a bill to require the Attorney General to propose a program for making treatment for post-traumatic stress disorder and acute stress disorder available to public safety officers, and for other purposes.

S. 857

At the request of Mr. CURTIS, the name of the Senator from New Mexico (Mr. LUJÁN) was added as a cosponsor of S. 857, a bill to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to expand the exclusion for certain conservation subsidies to include subsidies for water conservation or efficiency measures, storm water management measures, and wastewater management measures.

S. 1330

At the request of Mr. BLUMENTHAL, the names of the Senator from California (Mr. SCHIFF) and the Senator from New Hampshire (Mrs. SHAHEEN) were added as cosponsors of S. 1330, a bill to advance research to achieve medical breakthroughs in brain tumor treatment and improve awareness and adequacy of specialized cancer and brain tumor care.

S. 1599

At the request of Mr. LUJÁN, the name of the Senator from California (Mr. SCHIFF) was added as a cosponsor of S. 1599, a bill to address maternity care shortages and promote optimal maternity outcomes by expanding educational opportunities for midwives, and for other purposes.

S. 1829

At the request of Mr. HAWLEY, the name of the Senator from West Virginia (Mr. JUSTICE) was added as a cosponsor of S. 1829, a bill to combat the sexual exploitation of children by supporting victims and promoting accountability and transparency by the tech industry.

S. 1890

At the request of Mr. GRASSLEY, the name of the Senator from Delaware (Mr. COONS) was added as a cosponsor of S. 1890, a bill to establish a grant program for certain State and local forensic activities, and for other purposes.

S. 2096

At the request of Mr. WHITEHOUSE, the name of the Senator from Pennsylvania (Mr. FETTERMAN) was added as a cosponsor of S. 2096, a bill to amend titles 10 and 38, United States Code, to make certain improvements in the Transition Assistance Program and Solid Start Program to address mental health issues, and for other purposes.

At the request of Ms. BALDWIN, the names of the Senator from Minnesota (Ms. SMITH) and the Senator from Connecticut (Mr. MURPHY) were added as cosponsors of S. 2195, a bill to award a Congressional Gold Medal, collectively, to the brave women who served in World War II as members of the U.S. Army Nurse Corps and U.S. Navy Nurse Corps.

S. 2265

At the request of Mr. PADILLA, the names of the Senator from Maryland (Ms. ALSOBROOKS), the Senator from New York (Mrs. GILLIBRAND), the Senator from Washington (Mrs. MURRAY), the Senator from Colorado (Mr. BENNET), the Senator from Hawaii (Ms. HIRONO) and the Senator from Arkansas (Mr. BOOZMAN) were added as cosponsors of S. 2265, a bill to require the Secretary of the Treasury to mint coins in commemoration of the 2028 Olympic and Paralympic Games in Los Angeles, California, and the 2034 Olympics and Paralympic Winter Games in Salt Lake City, Utah.

S. 2404

At the request of Mr. LEE, the name of the Senator from Tennessee (Mr. HAGERTY) was added as a cosponsor of S. 2404, a bill to subject emergency legislation enacted by the District of Columbia Council to expedited congressional disapproval procedures.

S. 2684

At the request of Mr. MERKLEY, the name of the Senator from Pennsylvania (Mr. MCCORMICK) was added as a cosponsor of S. 2684, a bill to support countries in Latin America and the Caribbean that maintain official diplomatic relations with Taiwan, to counter efforts by the People's Republic of China to coerce or pressure governments into breaking such ties, to deepen coordination with Taiwan on diplomatic, development, and economic engagement in the Western Hemisphere, and for other purposes.

S. 2907

At the request of Mrs. BLACKBURN, the name of the Senator from South Dakota (Mr. ROUNDS) was added as a cosponsor of S. 2907, a bill to prohibit health care professionals, hospitals, or clinics from participating in the chemical or surgical mutilation of a child

and to provide a private right of action for children and the parents of children whose healthy body parts have been damaged by medical professionals practicing chemical and surgical mutilation.

S. 3041

At the request of Mr. GRASSLEY, the names of the Senator from Minnesota (Ms. KLOBUCHAR), the Senator from Hawaii (Ms. HIRONO), the Senator from Connecticut (Mr. BLUMENTHAL), the Senator from California (Mr. PADILLA), the Senator from Vermont (Mr. WELCH), the Senator from New Jersey (Mr. BOOKER) and the Senator from Texas (Mr. CRUZ) were added as cosponsors of S. 3041, a bill to allow the U.S. Marshals Service to assist in certain Tribal criminal matters, and for other purposes.

S. 3056

At the request of Mr. BUDD, the name of the Senator from Pennsylvania (Mr. MCCORMICK) was added as a cosponsor of S. 3056, a bill to state the policy of the United States with respect to religious freedom in the People's Republic of China, and for other purposes.

S. 3064

At the request of Mr. DAINES, the name of the Senator from Kansas (Mr. MARSHALL) was added as a cosponsor of S. 3064, a bill to amend title XVIII of the Social Security Act to ensure appropriate access to non-opioid pain management drugs for chronic pain conditions under part D of the Medicare program.

S. 3249

At the request of Mrs. SHAHEEN, the names of the Senator from Pennsylvania (Mr. MCCORMICK) and the Senator from Virginia (Mr. KAINE) were added as cosponsors of S. 3249, a bill to enhance United States Government strategic coordination of the security, installation, maintenance, and repair of international subsea fiber-optic cables.

S. 3330

At the request of Mr. LUJÁN, the name of the Senator from Pennsylvania (Mr. MCCORMICK) was added as a cosponsor of S. 3330, a bill to impose sanctions with respect to persons that contribute to international trafficking of illicit drugs, including companies of the People's Republic of China that supply fentanyl precursors and certain cartels that traffic fentanyl into the United States, and for other purposes.

S. 3855

At the request of Mr. BUDD, the name of the Senator from North Dakota (Mr. CRAMER) was added as a cosponsor of S. 3855, a bill to enhance bilateral defense cooperation between the United States and Israel, and for other purposes.

S. 3894

At the request of Mrs. SHAHEEN, the name of the Senator from Michigan (Ms. SLOTKIN) was added as a cosponsor of S. 3894, a bill to prohibit the Department of Homeland Security from constructing, acquiring, renovating, or operating any new processing site or detention center without providing a

mechanism for public comments regarding such activity, entering into a signed, written agreement with appropriate State and local officials, and providing Congress with advance notice of such activity.

S. 3897

At the request of Mr. GRASSLEY, the names of the Senator from Minnesota (Ms. KLOBUCHAR), the Senator from North Carolina (Mr. TILLIS), the Senator from Hawaii (Ms. HIRONO), the Senator from Connecticut (Mr. BLUMENTHAL), the Senator from California (Mr. PADILLA), the Senator from Vermont (Mr. WELCH) and the Senator from New Jersey (Mr. BOOKER) were added as cosponsors of S. 3897, a bill to revise administrative procedures relating to public safety officers' death benefits, and for other purposes.

S. 3966

At the request of Mr. GRASSLEY, his name and the names of the Senator from Illinois (Mr. DURBIN), the Senator from South Carolina (Mr. GRAHAM), the Senator from Florida (Mrs. MOODY), the Senator from North Carolina (Mr. TILLIS), the Senator from Louisiana (Mr. KENNEDY), the Senator from Delaware (Mr. COONS), the Senator from Hawaii (Ms. HIRONO), the Senator from Connecticut (Mr. BLUMENTHAL), the Senator from California (Mr. PADILLA) and the Senator from New Jersey (Mr. BOOKER) were added as cosponsors of S. 3966, a bill to prohibit the enforcement of certain contractual clauses that restrict disclosure of sexual abuse of minors, and for other purposes.

tient protections with respect to the cost of insulin.

S. 4281

At the request of Mr. RICKETTS, the names of the Senator from Indiana (Mr. BANKS) and the Senator from Massachusetts (Ms. WARREN) were added as cosponsors of S. 4281, a bill to provide for export restrictions on certain semiconductor manufacturing equipment and components therefor, and for other purposes.

At the request of Ms. ERNST, the name of the Senator from Alabama (Mrs. BRITT) was added as a cosponsor of S. 4378, a bill to combat fraud in Federal programs, and for other purposes.
