S. 4791

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

#### SECTION 1. SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT IN TRUMP V. INTERNAL REVENUE SERVICE.

(a) ABOLISHING THE ANTI-WEAPONIZATION FUND.—The Anti-Weaponization Fund established by the Attorney General in connection with the disposition in *Trump v. Internal*
