A bill to amend the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act to prohibit the approval of new abortion drugs, to prohibit investigational use exemptions for abortion drugs, and to impose additional regulatory requirements with respect to previously approved abortion drugs, and for other purposes; to the Committee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions.

At the request of Mr. LEE, the names of the Senator from Alabama (Mrs. BRITT), the Senator from Tennessee (Mr. HAGERTY), the Senator from Pennsylvania (Mr. MCCORMICK), the Senator from Nebraska (Mrs. FISCHER), the Senator from Indiana (Mr. YOUNG) and the Senator from Wyoming (Mr. BARRASSO) were added as cosponsors of S. 128, a bill to amend the National Voter Registration Act of 1993 to require proof of United States citizenship to register an individual to vote in elections for Federal office, and for other purposes.

S. 142

S. 813

S. 877

At the request of Mr. SCHUMER, the names of the Senator from Maine (Mr. KING) and the Senator from North Dakota (Mr. CRAMER) were added as cosponsors of S. 877, a bill to require the Secretary of the Treasury to mint commemorative coins in recognition of the life and legacy of Roberto Clemente.

S. 1395

S. 2731
