At the request of Mr. DAINES, the name of the Senator from Virginia (Mr. KAINE) was added as a cosponsor of S. 3064, a bill to amend title XVIII of the Social Security Act to ensure appropriate access to non-opioid pain management drugs for chronic pain conditions under part D of the Medicare program.

S. 3213
