Whereas, during the year following the shooting, many volunteer counselors traveled to North Shore School District 112 and Township High School District 113 to assist the community in the process of healing;

Whereas members of the Highland Park, Highwood, Waukegan, and North Chicago communities, along with communities across the entire North Shore, the State of Illinois, the United States, and the world remain united in support of the victims of this horrific massacre and their families on its 4-year anniversary;

Whereas, according to the Gun Violence Archive, the tragic mass shooting that occurred in Highland Park was 1 of 10 mass shootings that occurred on July 4, 2022; and

Whereas senseless gun violence has caused devastation, trauma, and grief to too many families and communities across the United States: Now, therefore, be it

Resolved, That the Senate—

(1) expresses sincere condolences to the families, friends, and loved ones of Katherine Goldstein, Irina McCarthy, Kevin McCarthy, Stephen Straus, Jacquelyn Sundheim, Nicolas Toledo-Zaragoza, and Eduardo Uvaldo, the victims of the devastating shooting along the parade route on July 4, 2022, in Highland Park, Illinois;

(2) honors the lives and memory of the victims, with gratitude for their selfless dedication to others;

(3) continues to extend support to the individuals who were injured and subjected to the trauma of the shooting;

(4) expresses gratitude to the law enforcement officers, medical personnel, and emergency responders who responded to the shooting with professionalism, dedication, and bravery; and

(5) stands in solidarity with the victims of senseless gun violence in communities across the United States.

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 35—PROVIDING FOR A JOINT SESSION OF THE CONGRESS IN PHILADELPHIA, PENNSYLVANIA, ON THURSDAY, JULY 2, 2026, IN HONOR OF THE SEMIQUINCENTENNIAL OF THE DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE

Whereas the city of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, was founded in 1682;

Whereas Philadelphia has become known as the Nation's birthplace for the critical role it played in the founding of the United States of America;

Whereas Philadelphia was the meeting place for the first Continental Congress, the second Continental Congress, and the Constitutional Convention;

Whereas Philadelphia served as the capital of the United States from 1790 through 1800;

Whereas, on July 4, 1776, the Second Continental Congress approved the Declaration of Independence in Philadelphia, at the Pennsylvania State House, now known as Independence Hall;

Whereas the Declaration of Independence officially severed the 13 colonies' ties to the British Crown;

Whereas Independence Hall is 1 of only 26 cultural World Heritage sites in the United States of America;

Whereas Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, became the first World Heritage City in the United States of America;

Whereas, shortly after the conclusion of the Constitutional Convention, Benjamin Franklin proclaimed of the Rising Sun Armchair at Independence Hall, "I have often looked at that picture behind the president without being able to tell whether it was rising or setting. But now at length I have the happiness to know that it is a rising and not a setting sun";

Whereas across from Independence Hall stands the Liberty Bell, displaying the phrase "Proclaim Liberty Throughout All the Land Unto All the Inhabitants thereof";

Whereas only on 2 occasions since the United States Capitol moved to Washington, District of Columbia, in 1800 has Congress convened outside of the District of Columbia;

Whereas, on July 16, 1987, Congress met at Independence Hall in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, to "honor the bicentennial of the Constitution" and commemorate "the 200th anniversary of the Great Compromise of the Constitutional Convention";

Whereas, on September 6, 2002, Congress met at Federal Hall in New York, New York, "in remembrance of the victims and heroes of September 11, 2001, and in recognition of the courage and spirit of the City of New York"; and

Whereas, July 4, 2026, will serve as the semiquincentennial, or 250th anniversary, of the founding of the United States: Now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the Senate (the House of Representatives concurring), That, in honor of the semiquincentennial of the Declaration of Independence, the two Houses of the Congress shall assemble in a joint session at the Independence National Historical Park in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, on Thursday, July 2, 2026, for the purpose of commemorating the Declaration of Independence.

(1) in paragraph (1)—

(A) in the matter preceding subparagraph (A), by striking “subsection (c)(2)” and inserting “clause (i) or (ii) of subparagraph (A) of paragraph (3) or a drinking water well owner described in subparagraph (B) of that paragraph”;

(B) by striking “contaminant—” and all that follows through “to—” in subparagraph (A) in the matter preceding clause (i) and inserting “contaminant that is determined by the State—”;

(C) by striking subparagraph (B);

(D) by redesignating clauses (i) and (ii) as subparagraphs (A) and (B), respectively, and indenting appropriately;

(E) in subparagraph (A) (as so redesignated)—

(i) by inserting “to” before “be present”;

(ii) by striking “serving,” and inserting “serving a community”;

(iii) by striking “for, that community”;

and

(F) in subparagraph (B) (as so redesignated)—
