SENATE RESOLUTION 804—COMMEMORATING THE TENTH ANNIVERSARY OF THE 2016 WEST VIRGINIA FLOODS

Whereas, on June 23, 2016, several rounds of thunderstorms brought severe rainfall throughout West Virginia;

Whereas the “thousand-year event” resulted in devastating floods across the State and flash flooding caused 23 fatalities;

Whereas the Governor of West Virginia declared a State of Emergency in 44 of 55 West Virginia counties and the President declared a major disaster under section 401 of the Robert T. Stafford Relief and Emergency Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 5170);

Whereas the storms inflicted catastrophic damage, estimated at \$1,200,000,000;

Whereas more than 500,000 people lost power, and thousands of homes and businesses were either damaged or destroyed;

Whereas roads and bridges were washed out, and multiple schools were completely destroyed;

Whereas communities across West Virginia were entirely underwater;

Whereas countless first responders and neighbors stepped in to protect residents of affected communities; and

Whereas West Virginia communities have shown great resilience and strength to rebuild homes, businesses, schools, and other sites affected by the floods: Now, therefore, be it

Resolved, That the Senate—

(1) commemorates the tenth anniversary of the floods in West Virginia on June 23, 2016; and

(2) honors the West Virginians who lost their lives and those who were affected by the floods.

SENATE RESOLUTION 805—CELEBRATING THE HISTORIC SIGNIFICANCE OF THE 2026 FEDERATION INTERNATIONALE DE FOOTBALL ASSOCIATION (FIFA) WORLD CUP AND WELCOMING THE INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY TO NORTH AMERICA FOR THE FIRST TOURNAMENT HOSTED BY 3 NATIONS

Mr. WELCH (for himself and Mr. CRAMER) submitted the following resolution; which was considered and agreed to:

S. RES. 805

Whereas soccer is widely recognized as one of the most popular sports in the world, with billions of fans across every continent;

Whereas the 1994 Fédération Internationale de Football Association (referred to in this preamble as “FIFA”) World Cup, hosted by the United States, was the most attended in history, having drawn nearly 3,600,000 spectators;

Whereas the legacy of the 1994 FIFA World Cup fundamentally changed the trajectory of soccer in the United States, fueling the 1996 launch of Major League Soccer and the creation of new professional pathways for players from the United States;

Whereas the 2026 FIFA World Cup is a milestone in sports history as the first tournament to feature an expanded field of 48 national teams and a record 104 matches;

Whereas, for the first time in the history of the competition, the 2026 FIFA World Cup is being jointly hosted by 3 nations: the United States, Canada, and Mexico; and

Whereas the “United Bid” of our 3 nations exemplifies the spirit of continental unity and cooperation among our great neighbors, with matches scheduled across 16 iconic host cities, including 11 in the United States, 3 in Mexico, and 2 in Canada: Now, therefore, be it

Resolved, That the Senate—

(1) welcomes fans and players from around the world to the United States for the 2026 Fédération Internationale de Football Association (referred to in this resolution as “FIFA”) World Cup;

(2) thanks our neighbors and partners, Canada and Mexico, for their historic collaboration in bringing the FIFA World Cup back to North America;

(3) recognizes the 16 host cities for their dedication to fans and players from all 48 participating nations; and

(4) supports the continued use of sports as a banner of peace, friendship, and fair competition to unite the global public.

At the appropriate place in title II, insert the following:

SEC. ____ . NAVY UNIVERSITY RESEARCH INITIATIVES.

(a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any other provision of this Act, the Secretary of the Navy shall continue the Navy University Research Initiatives (PE 0601103N) and shall carry out the activities funded under such program element during fiscal year 2027.

(b) FUNDING.—

(1) ADDITIONAL FUNDING.—The amount authorized to be appropriated for fiscal year 2027 by section 201 for research, development, test, and evaluation is hereby increased by \$41,900,000.

(2) OFFSET.—The amount authorized to be appropriated for fiscal year 2027 by section 301 for operations and maintenance is hereby reduced by \$41,900,000.

(c) AVAILABILITY FOR NAVY UNIVERSITY RESEARCH INITIATIVES.—Notwithstanding section 4201, of the amount authorized to be appropriated for fiscal year 2027 by section 201 for research, development, test, and evaluation, as revised by subsection (b)(1), up to \$116,900,000 shall be available for Navy University Research Initiatives (PE 0601103N).
