INTRODUCTION OF BILLS AND JOINT RESOLUTIONS

S. 5037. A bill to amend title XIX of the Social Security Act to make all children eligi-

ble for Medicaid from birth until age 26, to require States to automatically enroll children and young adults under age 26 in the State Medicaid program, and for other purposes; to the Committee on Finance.

S. 5038. A bill to prohibit the transfer of the functions of the Office of Special Education and Rehabilitative Services; to the Committee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions.

S. 204

At the request of Mr. SCOTT of South Carolina, the name of the Senator from North Carolina (Mr. BUDD) was added as a cosponsor of S. 204, a bill to protect the right of parents to direct the upbringing of their children as a fundamental right.

S. 1234
