S. 5122. A bill to guarantee the right to vote for all citizens regardless of conviction of a criminal offense, and for other purposes; to the Committee on the Judiciary.

S. Res. 814. A resolution recognizing the importance of independent living and economic self-sufficiency for individuals with disabilities made possible by the Americans

with Disabilities Act of 1990 and calling to protect the right of individuals with disabilities to live in their own homes and communities; to the Committee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions.

S. Res. 815. A resolution commending the Chicago Cubs baseball teams as it celebrates its 150th anniversary on August 29, 2026; to the Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation.

ADDITIONAL COSPONSORS

S. 142

At the request of Mr. BARRASSO, the name of the Senator from California (Mr. PADILLA) was added as a cosponsor of S. 142, a bill to award a Congressional Gold Medal to wildland firefighters in recognition of their strength, resiliency, sacrifice, and service to protect the forests, grasslands, and communities of the United States, and for other purposes.

S. 185

At the request of Mr. TILLIS, the name of the Senator from South Carolina (Ms. GRAHAM) was added as a cosponsor of S. 185, a bill to provide a civil remedy for individuals harmed by sanctuary jurisdiction policies, and for other purposes.

S. 304

At the request of Ms. GRAHAM, her name was added as a cosponsor of S. 304, a bill to amend section 301 of the Immigration and Nationality Act to clarify those classes of individuals born in the United States who are nationals and citizens of the United States at birth.

S. 494

At the request of Mr. SCHMITT, the name of the Senator from Colorado (Mr. BENNET) was added as a cosponsor of S. 494, a bill to establish a national plan to coordinate research on epilepsy, and for other purposes.

S. 1169

At the request of Mr. RISCH, the name of the Senator from Indiana (Mr. BANKS) was added as a cosponsor of S. 1169, a bill to prohibit State excise taxes on firearms and ammunition manufacturers and dealers.

S. 1517

At the request of Ms. ERNST, the name of the Senator from South Carolina (Ms. GRAHAM) was added as a cosponsor of S. 1517, a bill to include sexual assault and aggravated sexual violence in the definition of aggravated felony under the Immigration and Na-

tionality Act in order to expedite the removal of aliens convicted of any such crime.

S. 1541

At the request of Mr. KELLY, the name of the Senator from Nevada (Ms. ROSEN) was added as a cosponsor of S. 1541, a bill to support the national defense and economic security of the United States by supporting vessels, ports, and shipyards of the United States and the U.S. maritime workforce.

S. 1952

At the request of Mrs. BLACKBURN, the name of the Senator from South Carolina (Ms. GRAHAM) was added as a cosponsor of S. 1952, a bill to amend title 18, United States Code, to establish a criminal prohibition on the public release of the name of a Federal law enforcement officer with the intent to obstruct a criminal investigation or immigration enforcement operation.

S. 2223

At the request of Mr. YOUNG, the names of the Senator from Colorado (Mr. HICKENLOOPER) and the Senator from Ohio (Mr. MORENO) were added as cosponsors of S. 2223, a bill to amend the Small Business Investment Act of 1958 to increase the amount that may be invested in small business investment companies.

S. 2229

At the request of Mr. SULLIVAN, the names of the Senator from Connecticut (Mr. BLUMENTHAL) and the Senator from Illinois (Ms. DUCKWORTH) were added as cosponsors of S. 2229, a bill to require the Secretary of the Treasury to mint a coin in recognition of the Foreign Service of the United States and its contribution to United States diplomacy.

S. 3054

At the request of Mr. CORNYN, the name of the Senator from South Carolina (Ms. GRAHAM) was added as a cosponsor of S. 3054, a bill to amend the William Wilberforce Trafficking Victims Protection Reauthorization Act of 2008 and the Homeland Security Act of 2002 to enhance efforts to combat the trafficking of children.

S. 3085

At the request of Mr. RISCH, the name of the Senator from Indiana (Mr. BANKS) was added as a cosponsor of S. 3085, a bill to ensure that certain operations, functions, and services of the Federal Government relating to enforcement of firearms laws and firearm export licensing continue during a lapse in appropriations.

S. 3103

At the request of Mr. DAINES, the names of the Senator from South Carolina (Mr. SCOTT) and the Senator from Colorado (Mr. BENNET) were added as cosponsors of S. 3103, a bill to authorize the extension of nondiscriminatory treatment (normal trade relations treatment) to products of certain countries.

S. 3197

At the request of Mr. LEE, the name of the Senator from South Carolina

(Ms. GRAHAM) was added as a cosponsor of S. 3197, a bill to amend title 18, United States Code, to establish a rebuttable presumption that a defendant who is not a United States citizen or lawful permanent resident poses a danger to the community and a serious risk of flight, for purposes of determining whether to release or detain the defendant pending trial.

S. 3267

At the request of Ms. COLLINS, the name of the Senator from New Hampshire (Ms. HASSAN) was added as a cosponsor of S. 3267, a bill to amend title XVIII of the Social Security Act to provide for Medicare coverage of blood-based dementia screening tests.

S. 3314

At the request of Mr. SHEEHY, the name of the Senator from Indiana (Mr. BANKS) was added as a cosponsor of S. 3314, a bill to direct the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to expand a directive of the Veterans Health Administration regarding informed consent to apply to certain types of medications.

S. 3589

At the request of Mr. BANKS, the name of the Senator from Virginia (Mr. KAINE) was added as a cosponsor of S. 3589, a bill to amend the Higher Education Act of 1965 to provide students with disabilities and their families with access to critical information needed to select the right college and succeed once enrolled.

At the request of Mr. SCHMITT, the name of the Senator from South Carolina (Ms. GRAHAM) was added as a cosponsor of S. 3674, a bill to expand and clarify the grounds for civil denaturalization proceedings for individuals who have defrauded a governmental program, joined a terrorist organization, or committed certain criminal offenses.

S. 3675

At the request of Mr. CORNYN, the name of the Senator from South Carolina (Ms. GRAHAM) was added as a cosponsor of S. 3675, a bill to amend title 18, United States Code, to protect U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement agents, as well as other Federal law enforcement officers, and for other purposes.

S. 3805

At the request of Ms. GRAHAM, her name was added as a cosponsor of S. 3805, a bill to amend chapter 93 of title 18, United States Code, to prohibit obstruction of immigration laws by official interference.
