INTRODUCTION OF BILLS AND JOINT RESOLUTIONS

S. 5133. A bill to amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to modify the time for filing certain information returns; to the Committee on Finance.

By Mr. MARKEY (for himself, Ms. WARREN, Mr. SANDERS, Mr. MERKLEY, and Mr. BOOKER):

S. 5134. A bill to establish a Green New Deal for Health to prepare and empower the health care sector to protect the health and well-being of our workers, our communities, and our planet in the face of the climate crisis, and for other purposes; to the Committee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions.

By Mr. SCHIFF:

S. 5135. A bill to amend the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971 to clarify that the prohibition under such Act against the fraudulent misrepresentation of campaign authority and the fraudulent solicitation of funds includes misrepresentation through the use of content generated in whole or in part with the use of artificial intelligence (generative AI), and for other purposes; to the Committee on Rules and Administration.

By Mr. SCHIFF:

S. 5136. A bill to amend the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971 to require a disclaimer for certain communications paid for by a political committee, and for other purposes; to the Committee on Rules and Administration.

By Mr. KING:

S. 5137. A bill to direct the Secretary of Health and Human Services, acting through the Administrator of the Health Resources and Services Administration, to establish a grant program to be known as the Mental Health Licensure Portability Program to award grants to eligible entities, and for other purposes; to the Committee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions.

By Ms. CORTEZ MASTO:

S. 5138. A bill to protect immigrant families, combat fraud, promote citizenship, and

build community trust, and for other purposes; to the Committee on the Judiciary.

By Mr. ROUNDS (for himself and Mr. BLUMENTHAL):

S. 5139. A bill to require the Secretary of Defense to support development of quantum technologies, and for other purposes; to the Committee on Armed Services.

By Mr. JUSTICE:

S. 5140. A bill to ensure the fairness, transparency, and consistency of disqualifying provisions administered by the Commodity Futures Trading Commission and the Securities and Exchange Commission, and for other purposes; to the Committee on Banking, Housing, and Urban Affairs.

ADDITIONAL COSPONSORS

S. 137

At the request of Mr. DAINES, the names of the Senator from South Carolina (Ms. GRAHAM) and the Senator from West Virginia (Mrs. CAPITO) were added as cosponsors of S. 137, a bill to amend title 41, United States Code, to prohibit the Federal Government from entering into contracts with an entity that discriminates against firearm or ammunition industries, and for other purposes.

S. 345

At the request of Mr. LEE, the name of the Senator from South Carolina (Ms. GRAHAM) was added as a cosponsor of S. 345, a bill to provide that silencers be treated the same as firearms accessories.

S. 401

At the request of Mr. CRAMER, the name of the Senator from South Carolina (Ms. GRAHAM) was added as a cosponsor of S. 401, a bill to amend the Federal Reserve Act to prohibit certain financial service providers who deny fair access to financial services from using taxpayer funded discount window lending programs, and for other purposes.

S. 469

At the request of Ms. ERNST, the name of the Senator from Pennsylvania (Mr. MCCORMICK) was added as a cosponsor of S. 469, a bill to restore the exemption of family farms and small businesses from the definition of assets under title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965.

S. 478

At the request of Mr. KENNEDY, the name of the Senator from South Carolina (Ms. GRAHAM) was added as a cosponsor of S. 478, a bill to amend title 38, United States Code, to prohibit the Secretary of Veterans Affairs from transmitting certain information to the Department of Justice for use by the national instant criminal background check system.

S. 537

At the request of Mr. DAINES, the name of the Senator from South Carolina (Ms. GRAHAM) was added as a cosponsor of S. 537, a bill to prohibit the Secretary of the Interior and the Secretary of Agriculture from prohibiting the use of lead ammunition or tackle on certain Federal land or water under
