**Harnessing Energy At Thermal Sources Act of 2026:** The House passed H.R. 5587, to amend the Geothermal Steam Act of 1970 to waive the requirement for a Federal drilling permit for certain activities, to exempt certain activities from the requirements of the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969, by a yea-and-nay vote of 231 yeas to 186 nays, Roll No. 137. **Pages H3073–77**
